	Complete the HESI Testing in the ILC at the Quad-Cities by September 30, 2024 if wanting admission for Spring 2025. You must have a minimum overall score of 70. Retests are allowed once per application cycle, but there must be a 3-week gap between the 1st test and the 2nd test.
	Complete the Prospective Nursing Student Orientation. In order to access the Orientation, you need to complete these steps: 1) Apply to Black Hawk College at www.bhc.edu/apply 2) 48 hours after submitting the application you will need to log into myblackhawk. You can find directions at www.bhc.edu/mybhc 3) Once you have logged into myblackhawk you will need to type in this URL www.bhc.edu/nursingorientation . 4) Click on the "Enroll in Course" button. 5) Follow the prompts to complete the Orientation. It will take approximately an hour to complete. All students applying for the ADN program will need to complete the Prospective Nursing Student Orientation each time you apply.

Incomplete applications <u>will not</u> be reviewed for placement in the Associate Degree Nursing program.

Admission Requirements

All applicants should review the College catalog for Black Hawk College admission requirements. In addition to meeting Black Hawk College admission requirements, the student who wishes to enter the Associate Degree Nursing Program must meet the following requirements:

- Earned a high school diploma or the equivalent;
- 2. Have a 2.7 (C+) GPA in all prerequisites and general education courses. If applying as Advanced Standing, nursing courses will also be counted towards GPA. Developmental courses are not counted into the GPA.
- 3. Completion of prerequisites for required courses with a grade of "C" or above, except Biology 145 which requires a "B" or above. Priority will be given to students that have completed BIOL 146 with a "B" or above. Completion of BIOL 145 and 146 must be within 5 years. Completion of BIOL 261 must be within 7 years.
- 4. Completion of all developmental courses determined by the college placement test with a grade of "C" or above.
- 5. Completion of HESI Exam. A minimum overall score of 70 is required to be considered for admission. HESI exam must be retaken if taken before July 1, 2023. Retests are allowed once per application cycle, but there must be a 3-week gap between the first and the second test.
- Achieved an SAT composite score of 480 or ACT composite score of 20 or greater if the applicant graduated from high school within the last year and has less than 9 credit hours of college courses.
- 7. High school applicants who do not meet GPA, did not graduate within the top 25% of their high school class, and any applicant with no college courses must take nine semester hours of college level courses.
- 8. Possess physical ability to provide client care.
- 9. Complete the Prospective Nursing Student Orientation online at www.bhc.edu/nursingorientation (see instructions on the ADN checklist).
